But whatever the ship could be,

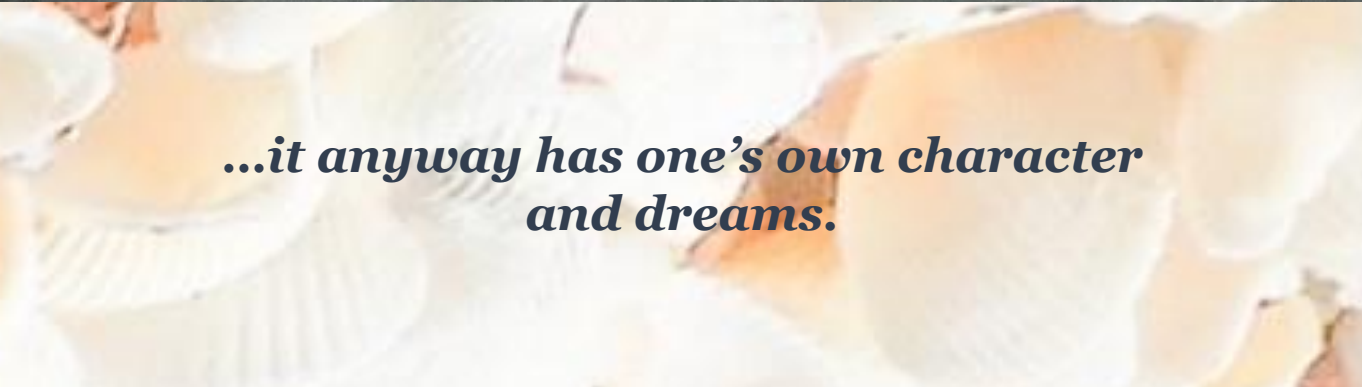


*...and
